#### General Assembly of the Church of God in Michigan-Statement of Membership

- A. The pastor of each congregation within the state of Michigan.
- B. The members of all the recognized ministries and committees of this organization.
- C. The associate pastors/ministers called by each congregation on a full-time or part-time basis.
- D. One layperson chosen as an official representative by each Michigan Church of God congregation with an average weekly attendance to 100; two laypersons from each congregation with an average weekly attendance of 101–500; three laypersons from each

- congregation with an average weekly attendance of 501–1000; and four laypersons from each congregation with an average weekly attendance of 1,001 and above.
- E. All others who are registered in the current Yearbook of the Church of God or have served as past chairs of the Michigan General Assembly, and who reside in Michigan and worship in Church of God congregations in Michigan.

10:33 a.m. The Vice Chair Charles Nebus called the first session/meeting to order. Charles Nebus Opened the meeting with a word of Prayer.

10:40 a.m. Charles Nebus asked the General Assembly to review with him the Statement of Membership found on page 3 of the package.

Charles Nebus read the Statement, and so let the minutes reflect that we have a quorum present for the 104<sup>th</sup> General Assembly.

10:41 a.m. Charles Nebus shared with the General Assembly the previous minutes found on pages 8-13, and that the previous minutes have been reviewed and approved prior to the General Assembly meeting.

10:42 a.m. Charles Nebus gave an introduction to the General Assembly of the eight candidates that are ready for ordination, from page 28 of the booklet, with the presentation videos of the first three.

10:53 a.m. Charles Nebus turned the meeting over to our State Pastor Mark Richardson and the Associate State Pastor Joshua Brandt.

State Pastor Mark Richardson:

- Moving forward-what will the next 30 years in the COG look like?

#### Credentials Ministry Report - Rev. JJ Perry, Chair

#### The Work Continues

The Credentials Team continues the work of meeting with those who are called into vocational ministry. Since the beginning of the year, we have met with 27 candidates, ranging from those at the very beginning of the ordination process to those who have completed every course and assignment. The Team licensed six candidates who completed their first year in Leadership Focus.

We are both thankful and blessed in the state of Michigan to see how God continues to provide new candidates and leaders to join the call for pastoral ministry in the Church of God. Overall, we have 36 individuals within the process of ordination, and of those, are eight brothers and sisters whom we will be ordaining at the General Assembly this November 2025. God is good.



#### **Changes and Challenges in Credentialing**

As Credentials Chair, I want to report that credentialing in the Church of God is changing. Both the requirements for ordination and the cost for Leadership Focus are rising.

We were made aware (three years ago) that changes were coming in writing the Theological Commitments, and now that our first candidates have completed their first year in this new format, it is important to report that this is a more rigorous credentialing process. Churches and pastors must continue to support our candidates as the writing has increased.

As for the second change, during the General Assembly in Denver, we were informed that there will be an increase in pricing for Leadership Focus. Once again, the state office, pastors, and churches will need to consider how we can support our ordination candidates through their calling to be ordained in the State of Michigan.
